Kotchakorn Voraakhom is a landscape architect from Thailand who works on building productive green public spaces that tackle climate change in urban dense areas and vulnerable communities. She created the first critical green infrastructure for Bangkok, the Chulalongkorn Centenary Park, and is currently planning the opening of a 36-acre urban farm rooftop featuring the biggest urban farming green roof in Asia.

Voraakhom was featured in the 2019 "TIME 100 Next" list as one of 15 leading women fighting against climate change and the "Green 30 for 2020" by Bloomberg. She is Chairwoman on the Landscape Architects Without Borders working group of the International Federation of Landscape Architects, Asia Pacific Region (IFLA APR).





## PROBLEMS IN ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN



In Thailand, we use the typical architectural design on every provincial, district, sub-district, community health center, as depicted above. Without the pandemic situation, we have continued to face physical related to service problems that do not fit into specific sites, cultures, and usage. With pandemic situations, it is clear that many typical designs are in urgent need of adjustment and change.

## PROBLEMS IN SERVICE DESIGN



Thailand has ranked Sixth Best in the World for Healthcare, but we still face the problem in service design experience of the patient, the slowness of service, and the density of service. During this pandemic, the pain points and its consequence are more apparent, without any solutions.

## PROBLEMS IN SPACE MANAGEMENT



Hospitals in a rural context in Thailand have much-wasted space due to the lack of physical planning and landscape architectural design.

## PROBLEMS IN CIRCULATION



Thai health service is oriented around health providers. Many district hospitals have faced the cross-circulation between each service point.

The over crowned patients and caretakers with many service steps within one place (1.registration, 2.patient current 3.health check, 4.waiting area, 5.arrange next appointment, 6.paying the fee and 7.taking drugs in the same area.)


## SITE INVESTIGATION



















After the hospital has faced the real covid case, we use the art therapy to relief the stress and finding the solution to fit in the future situation through arts.


## 1.3 HOSPITAL IN THAILAND DURING PANDEMIC SITUATION













































# Kotchakorn Voraakhom

Landscape architect

DESIGN

In a city infamous for its traffic, density, and frequent flooding, Kotchakorn designs parks that do more than provide residents with much-needed green space. She's built throughout Bangkok almost 50 acres of gardens, including a huge park designed to soak up the downpours that flood the Thai capital's streets in the wet season and store water during the months of dry weather. With few open spaces to work with, her gardens are sometimes found on concrete rooftops. Her latest project is the world's first river garden bridge and was built on top of a failed rail structure. It opens to the public in May. —Randy Thanthong-Knight

#### **GREEN FACT**

In December, her 22,000-square-foot park became Asia's largest urban farming rooftop garden.




